

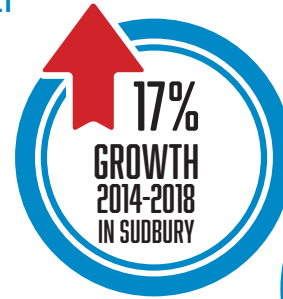

WHAT DO I DO?

Automotive Service Technicians inspect, diagnose, repair and service mechanical and electrical systems and components of cars and light trucks. Truck and Coach Technicians perform the same work on buses and transport trucks.

WHAT ARE MY COMMON DUTIES?

- Perform maintenance services such as oil changes, lubrications and tune-ups
- Test systems and components to diagnose faults
- Use tools and equipment to adjust, repair or replace parts and components

WHAT CONDITIONS DO I WORK IN?

- Mostly full-time
- Usually indoors
- Exposure to noise, vibration, liquids, fumes and odours
- Must be able to bend, stretch, kneel, lift and stand for long periods

WHERE CAN I WORK?

- Dealerships, garages and service stations
- Fleet maintenance and transportation companies
- Motor vehicle and parts manufacturers

WHAT IS INVOLVED?

- 1 Completion of Grade 12 or ministry-approved equivalent is needed to qualify for training
- 2 Apprenticeship can begin in high school through the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP)
- 3 Apprenticeship training takes approximately three and a half years
- 4 Apprenticeship training ends with writing and passing the Certificate of Qualification exam

 Red Seal certification is available upon completion of the interprovincial Red Seal exam
